Instructor Bios -

PAMELA L. CASELLA NIM (CO-FOUNDER & ARTISTIC DIRECTOR) — International Artist and graduate of the Curtis Institute of Music, Ms. Casella has performed in virtually all major houses in the U.S. and Europe. She was a favorite of Seattle Opera, San Francisco Opera, Los Angeles Opera, Fan Diego Opera, Houston Grand Opera, Dallas Opera, Climmerglass Opera, and the American Opera Center at Julliard, in Michigan, Pittsburgh and Vancouver. As winner of the Metropolitan Opera Competition, she was selected from a competition of 3,000 contestants to sing with Luciano Pavarotti, and was first place winner in the San Francisco Opera Merola Program. She has worked with conductors Nicola Rescigno, Eugene Onnandy, Zubin Mehta, and Kurt Adler to name a few. As a Columbia Artist she appeared with Seattle Opera as Woglinde (The Ring), First Lady (The Magic Flute), Micaela (Carmen), both Mimi and Musetta (La Boheme), High Priestess (Aida), Pousette (Manon), Santuzza (Cavalleria Rusticana), Donna Elvira in (Don Giovanni), Cio Cio San (Madama Butterfly), the Marguese (Un Giomo di Regno) Desdemona (Othello), and Ariadine (Ariadne auf Naxos). Concert performances include Anna (Nabucco) at Carnegie Hall, Marguerite (Faust) with Seattle Symphony, and the title for Tosca at Alice Tully Hall, in Bremen, and Genoa. She co-founded and is Artistic Director of Lyric Opera Northwest (now, the new Bellevue Opera).

CRAIG HEATH NIM (CO-PRODUCER & EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR) — International baritone Craig Nim has sung leading roles with New York City Opera, Pittsburgh, Seattle, Baltimore and Omaha Opera companies, and toured twice with the New York City Opera National Company, performing Mephistopheles in Gounod's Faust and Monterone in Verdi's Rigoletto. He sang Jochanaan in Strauss's Salome with Bremen Opera, Figaro (The Marriage of Figaro), and Escamillo (Carmen). At Santa Fe Opera, he sang the Dutchman in Wagner's Der Fliegende Hollander covering bass James Morris, and covered Michael Devlin as the Kommandant in Strauss's Friedenstag. Critics acclaimed his Verdi Requiem in Basel and Lucerne, leading to engagements at Victoria Concert Hall in Geneva as bass soloist in Handel's Semele, then touring Switzerland with Boris Goldovsky's company in La Bohéme and Don Giovanni. He sang Scarpia (Tosca) with Opera Omaha and NYC's Westchester Opera under Eve Queler. He sang Escamillo (Carmen) with Baltimore Opera, and the title role in Don Giovanni with Bronx Opera and the University of Washington. Nim received a William Matheus Sullivan Foundation grant (1988), won the Bruce Yarnell Voice Competition of baritones and basses from across the U.S. (1989), and was a prize winner in the Lauritz Melchior Heldentenor Competition (1996)! He toured the USA as featured soloist with New York Philharmonic, and sang with the St. Louis, Portland, Pittsburgh, Salt Lake City and Seattle Symphonies. He debuted on Broadway in The Three Musketeers and toured in Joseph Feld's Pirates of Penzance. He spent three seasons with Pittsburgh Civic Light Opera, and in many summer stock, dinner theater, concerts, recitals, oratorios, movies, commercials and broadcasts. After appearances with Seattle Opera (1970's), Nim co-founded and has performed with Lyric Opera Northwest as Escamillo (Carmen), Sharpless and Bonze (Madama Butterfly), Bartolo (Marriage of Figaro), Colline (La Bohéme), Scarpia (Tosca), and Brownley (Oliver!).

MICHAEL A. NIM (MR. BUMBLES & THE ARTFUL DODGER) — Baritone and tenor Michael Nim has appeared in numerous Lyric Opera Northwest productions including as the Artful Dodger in Oliver!, Angelotti in Tosca, Melchior in Amahl and the Night Visitors, Morales in Carmen, and, moving on to the tenor repertoire, as Goro in Madama Butterfly, Borsa in Rigoletto, and Alfredo in La Traviata. As a tenor concert soloist, he has been featured twice with the Federal Way Symphony. Recent engagements include tenor soloist in the Messiah at St. Marks, Alfredo in La Traviata with Lyric Opera Northwest at Meydenbauer Center Theatre, Arturo in Lucia di Lammermoor and El Remendado in Carmen and Nejus in The Merry Widow with Tacoma Opera. He was invited to sing in Turandot with Pacific Northwest Opera in Skagit County, coveried Rodolfo in Lyric Opera Northwest's 2018 La Bohéme and gave a solo recital at the Frye Art Museum. He has, for two years been theatrical instructor at the Little Masters Club in Bellevue and is currently teaching private voice lessons.

NOEL KORAN In an operatic and theatrical career that has spanned over forty years, Noel Koran has established himself as a stage director, educator and performer with extensive credentials in Opera, Operetta and Shakespeare. As a stage director, he has directed productions by such diverse composers and playwrights as Britten, Donizetti, Menotti, Mozart, Puccini, Shakespeare, and Verdi. Prior to becoming a stage director, he appeared on the stage hundreds of times In the US and Europe in a variety of musical and theatrical genres that include Opera, Operetta, Musicals, and Shakespeare. As an educator, he taught acting at several major universities and has helped countless singers improve their dramatic abilities on the stage.

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
